Code of Conduct for the Students

Students must abide by the following rules of the college. Any breach of discipline will be dealt with such punishment as the authority deems fit.

General

- > Students must be courteous to teachers, administration and office staff
- > Students should be amicable to fellow students
- > Students must observe decorum in their behaviour
- > Any discourteous behaviour towards members of other sexes shall be considered a serious offence and will invite stringent action like heavy fine and/or immediate expulsion
- ➤ Any offensive and/or obscene conduct/ behaviour within the college premises or any activity injurious to the academic atmosphere of the institution will invite stringent action.
- > Dresses should satisfy norms of decency.
- > Ragging or harassment, through any other form, is strictly prohibited and is considered a culpable and cognizable offence.

In the campus

- > Students must bring their identity cards to the college daily and should be able to produce it whenever asked for.
- > Students must not enter in any noisy or disorderly conduct in college premises. They must not loiter or gossip in the corridors and must not make commotion when waiting for a class.
- > Use of mobile camera phones for taking photographs is strictly prohibited within the campus.
- > Students must not deface the walls of the college or damage the college property or write anything indecent or indecorous on the blackboards or mutilate library books and periodicals.
- > Smoking or consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited within the campus or during any college activity. Violation of the norm will call for stringent action.

In the classroom

- > Students should present themselves sufficiently before the commencement of the class.
- > Students must not enter or leave a classroom, when the class is on, without prior permission of the concerned teacher
- > Impersonation at roll call is considered a grave offence.
- > Students should maintain decorum and discipline within the classroom.
- A class is collectively responsible for the conduct of its members.
- Students must also abide by the rules and regulations issued by the college during any specific college activity.
